



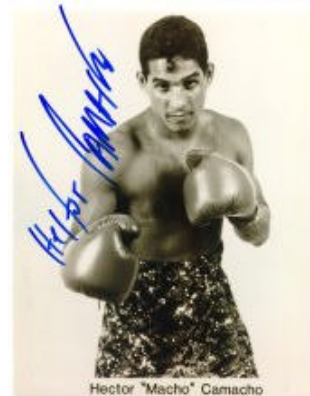
J.P. Concert Review

During the third round, Camacho slipped Bryan a few blows to the head and danced around the ring some more, throwing some of Bryan's infamous wild punches. This behaviour invoked some dislike in the crowd for they had begun shouting for a fight between Camacho and Oscar De La Hoya: obviously trying to fuel Camacho's straying fire (Camacho's only four losses have come against Oscar De La Hoya).

Finally, as Camacho regained complete control of the fight, his fire blew Bryan away with a few rights to the head. The bell rang to signal the end of the fight in the fourth round, due to a supposed facial cut on Bryan which called for a technical knock out for Camacho.

Casino Rama was definitely the place to be on Friday night. The 2000 boxing fans came from all over just to enjoy the live event before hitting the casino. Although the loudest cheers went to the ring girls in their bikinis, the event was a success and the fans got their money's worth with five matches on the card.
